Academic and Administrative Audit Report of Sakshi Malik Government College for Gilrs, Mokhra (Rohtak)

A Committee constituted by DGHE, Haryana vide letter no. DHE-2500001/2/2024, dated 20.02.2024 and MDU letter no. CB-1/2024/4472-4510, dated 23.04.2024 visited Sakshi Malik Govt. College for Gilrs, Mokhra (Rohtak) on 13.5.2024to carry out the Academic and Administrative Audit for the session 2023-2024

The members of the committee interacted with the faculty members, non-teaching staff and the students. They got their feedback about teaching, extra-curricularactivities, administrative work and other facilities from different sources. The members have gone through other official records.

Findings of the committee are as follows:

Curriculum Aspects:

- a) Only 01programmeis being run by the college.
 - B.A.- 3 years programme with an intake of 160 students.
- b) Total strength of the college is 201
- c) Total no. of sanctioned teaching posts are 10 out of which 09 faculty members are working, but 04 faculty members are on deputation to other colleges. Therefore, only 05 faculty members are available in Govt. College for Girls, Mokhra to teach the students. Most importantly, the faculty post for English language is vacant.
- d) Sanctioned non-teaching posts are 16 out of which 13 non-teaching staff is working including 02 contractual and 04 through HKRN.
- e) The syllabi of all the above-mentioned courses are mainly in accordance with M.D. University, Rohtak curriculum.
- f) Emphasis is also laid on enhancing the computer skills and overall personality development of the students.
- g) The feedback from the teachers, alumni, students and their parents were taken time to time in form of the feedback Performa and suggestions were incorporated.
- h) The college has a fully automated library equipped with a2364 number of books.
- i) The students have free accessibility to meet the Principal of the college as well as other faculty members whenever required.

Teaching-Learning Aspects:

- a) Every year admission to all programmesare made according to D.G.H.E and M.D.University, Rohtak rules as per schedule fixed by them through online system.
- b) Apart from regular examinations, the college has its own examination cell that strictly follows university norms for continuous evaluation of students in the form of class tests, assignments, regular presentations and group discussion.
- c) Tutorials/Mentoring classes are also conducted for the overall academic improvement and personality development of the students.
- d) Mentor Mentee ratio is 1:50- (Very High Ratio).

e) The future plan for the next academic year is still to be finalized to initiate and strengthen value adding facilities/practices for the students, faculty members and the college as a whole.
